III. Delight in Your Children

- 1 Thessalonians 2:11-12, 19
- Delight in your children
- Relationship is everything
- Be present emotionally and relationally, not just physically
- Parenting as pastors is not about perfection in certain methods. It's about consistency in building and sustaining relationship.

IV. Conclusion - Lean on Jesus

- God's power in my weakness
- Lean on the Spirit
- Never give up

Questions for the couples to deliberate

1. Name a few attributes of each of your children that you delight in. Why do your eyes light up when they come in the room?

2. If you struggle to delight in your kids, examine yourself. What are one or two barriers for you? Is it really something in them or something in you?3. Ask the Holy Spirit to supernaturally remove those obstacles and help you to delight in them.

4. Schedule a time right now to have a daddy/daughter, father/son, mother/son or mother/daughter "date." Think about something to do that they would enjoy that you could do together.

5. How can you help your kids see how they fit into what God is already doing in your ministry?
